JELLYS FERRY ROAD BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Bridge replacement project construction activities will not significantly affect public use of BLM recreational resources

What is Being Planned

Tehama County Public Works, in coordination with Caltrans and the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), is proposing to replace the Sacramento River Bridge at Jellys Ferry Road (Bridge No. 8C-0043). The existing Sacramento River Bridge serves as a crossing for Jelly's Ferry Road over the Sacramento River and is located 7.5 miles north from the Junction of Jelly's Ferry Road with Interstate 5. The proposed bridge replacement project is along the Sacramento River, within northern Tehama County, northwest of Table Mountain, approximately 9 miles north of Red Bluff and approximately 5 miles south of Shasta County (see location map, right). Construction of this project is scheduled to begin in summer of 2015.

Tehama County has studied the effects that this project may have on the environment. The studies show the proposed project will not significantly affect the quality of the environment.



Purpose of Notification

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Sacramento River Bend Area of Critical Environmental Concern surrounds the northern section of the bridge and approach roadway; this fact triggers the FHWA's Section 4(f) - a law which stipulates that the FHWA and other transportation agencies cannot approve the use of land from publicly owned parks, recreational areas, wildlife and waterfowl refuges, or public and private historical sites unless the following conditions apply:

- There is no feasible and prudent alternative to the use of land.
- The action includes all possible planning to minimize harm to the property resulting from use.

This notice serves to inform you: Under 49 USC 303(d), Caltrans has determined, and BLM has concurred, that the proposed project would result in a de minimis impact (no adverse effect to the activities, features or attributes qualifying the resource for protection under section 4(f) to the Recreation Area for purposes of Section 4(f). Existing activities, such as use of the Yana Trail, the boat ramp and general public recreation will continue during bridge construction. The Jellys Ferry River Access road and parking facilities will be replaced and access to the river will not be affected, except for a brief period during demolition of the existing bridge structure.
