AB3030 TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE
MEETING MINUTES OF APRIL 21, 2003

Present: Roger Sherrill; Gary Antone; Tom Heffernan; ; Walt Masell and Robert Steinacher. Absent: Jim Lowden; Steve Kimbrough; William Richardson and Kevin Borrer. Also present: Todd Hillaire, Dept of Water Resources and Carrie Metzger, Camp Dresser & McKee, Inc

1. CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by Gary Antone at 2:00 p.m.
2. INTRODUCTIONS: Introductions where made and Mr. Antone welcomed new member Walt Masell..
3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Motion by Roger Sherrill and second by Robert Steinacher to approve the March 17, 2003 minutes. After some discussion motion was postponed due to the absence of members.
4. PUBLIC COMMENT: No public comment.
5. INTRODUCTIONS OF RE-ELECTED & NEW TAC MEMBERS: Mr. Antone introduced Roger Sherrill, Jim Lowden and Walt Mansell. Mr. Mansell noted a misspelling of his name as "Mansell".
6. ELECTIONS:
 - a. Chairman Roger Sherrill nominates Gary Antone as Chairman seconded by Robert Steinacher. Gary Antone accepts nomination. Motion carried 6-0 with 3 absent.
 - b. Vice-Chairman A motion was made by Robert Steinacher to nominate Jim Lowden as Vice-Chair, seconded by Roger Sherrill. Motion carried 6-0 with 3 absent.
7. OVERVIEW OF SCADA INFORMATION: Item postponed due to absence of presenter Jim Lowden.
8. REVIEW OF LANDUSE AND WATER DEMAND DATA: Todd Hallaire presented an in depth review of information gathered on applied water balances, methodology for calculation on wet and drought year data information. Todd also presented data on water use demands gathered by agriculture crop types and wildlife refuges and the type of watering methods currently used.

Gary Antone and Roger Sherrill spoke of the need for cooperative agreements between Districts in drought year scenarios to meet the shortage in water supply versus demands.

Roger Sherrill discussed Assembly Bill 599, that if adopted, provides guidelines for a groundwater management program. He stressed that every groundwater management program in California would be subject to these conditions if they seek funding through the State.

Roger Sherrill continued that with the Comprehensive Groundwater Quality Monitoring Program

(AB599), this program will incorporate one data base.
