AB3030 TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE
MEETING MINUTES OF MARCH 17, 2003

Present: Serge Birk; Roger Sherrill; Gary Antone; Kevin Borrer; Tom Heffernan; Steve Kimbrough; William Richardson and Robert Steinacher. Absent: Jim Lowden. Also present: Ernie Ohlin, Water Resources Manager.

1. CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order by Chairman Serge Birk at 2:03 p.m.
2. INTRODUCTIONS: Waived.
3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Motion by Steve Kimbrough and second by Bill Richardson to approve the February 24, 2003 minutes. Carried by those present 8-0 with 1 absent.
4. PUBLIC COMMENT: Roger Sherrill announced the NSVWF on April 3, in Chico. The meeting will address SB1938 and other issues.
5. ANNUAL REPORT: Chairman Serge Birk presented the final draft of the Annual Report for review.

Corrections and recommendations were completed for presentation to the TCFC&WCD Board of Directors on March 25, 2003.

Motion by Bill Richardson and second by Bob Steinacher to approve the AB3030 Annual Report. Motion carried 8-0 with 1 absent.

6. STAFF REPORT:

- § Water Inventory Analysis Grant and Land Use in progress. Oral interview data is being reviewed.
- § DWR will be paid through Local Assistance for their work under this grant.
- § With the windfall of funds, staff will revise the scope of work to install dedicated multi-completion monitoring wells and data loggers.
- § Staff will report to TAC and request input on the location of the first three or four monitoring wells.
- § Winnie Jones offered her property for a monitoring well installation.
- § No word on third grant.
- § Interviews for AB3030 TAC positions held on March 14th. Results to be presented at March 25th TCFC&WCD meeting.
- § Deer Creek Water Exchange will appear before the Board of Supervisors March 18th. Board will have three weeks to review and schedule a public hearing.
- § The Small Water System Grant contracts were received. Staff will work with Environmental Health Department and RWQCB, gathering information on GIS, plot for depth and drought year information.

§ All information from BobVince, CDM, will be sent to the TAC for review. Input is requested.

7. ASSEMBLY BILL 599 & SENATE BILL 1938 GUIDELINES: Roger Sherrill discussed SB1938 from Senator Michaddo concerning recommended guidelines for a groundwater management program. The language in the bill is still being reviewed due to wording causing every groundwater management program in California subject to the bills conditions whether they seek funding or not. This bill mandates participation to be at the prescribed level and basin management objectives cannot be developed until this is done.

Roger Sherrill continued with the Comprehensive Groundwater Quality Monitoring Program (AB599). This program will take every basin and sub-basin in California, monitoring each in accordance with a priority list. The Groundwater Quality Act passed in 2001. This report tells the legislation how it will be done. This will incorporate all data into one database and information can be accessed all the way to the consumer. There will be tiered levels and exact locations of facilities will not be available to the public.

8. The next meeting will be April 21, 2003 in Red Bluff.
9. Chairman Serge Birk thanked the members for the opportunities and knowledge gained from the TAC. With no further business the meeting adjourned at 3:44 p.m.
